Seasonal Influenza controls



Please note that the Seasonal Influenza study is a case-control study. This means that for every case reported, we will also request data for two control women. For our data collection purposes we require **both** controls to deliver **before** the case, therefore please select the two women who delivered immediately before the case.

The need for controls is dependent on the research questions for a particular study; if we want to investigate and quantify risk factors for a particular condition, we need information about unaffected women to enable us to compare their characteristics of the women who are affected with the disorder. If we don't have control information, we can't do this. For example, for the uterine rupture study, obtaining information about two control women who had previous CS births enabled us to quantify the four-fold increase in the risk of uterine rupture associated with induction.

We appreciate that identifying and completing these controls can sometimes be an onerous and time-consuming task but the control data is incredibly helpful in enabling us to quantify risk factors for certain conditions.

High Neuraxial Block

The reporting for High Neuraxial Block is slightly different from other study reporting. Please note that when you report a case you will be sent an email asking you to choose a type from the following options:

- B De novo epidural first dose
- C Top up of epidural/Top up of epidural component of CSE
- D Top up of epidural/Top up of epidural component of CSE after resited epidural catheter
- E Single shot spinal/Spinal component of CSE
- F Single shot spinal/Spinal component of CSE after epidural catheter
- G Top up of an intentionally threaded epidural catheter into the intrathecal space (ie intrathecal catheter)

Case definition: All women with prior Fontan repair who have a pregnancy, regardless of outcome. Starting in January 2019 – more details in the next newsletter.

Reporting of Cirrhosis cases

We have noted that the number of reported cases of Cirrhosis is lower than expected. This may be because only women with more severe disease are being reported. Please ensure that you report **ALL** women with Cirrhosis, not just women who have decompensated Cirrhosis. Thank you!
