Meet some of our new members below and look out for more member profiles in our next newsletter!

Sarah Davies qualified as a midwife in 2007 and began working some of her hours in research on the FM Alert trial in 2012. Sarah now manages both the Neonatal and Reproductive Health and Childbirth Portfolios across North Wales and became an NIHR RH&C Champion representing Wales in 2019.

Sarah was the local lead reporter for the UKOSS COVID study, and is a registered UKOSS reporter.

In early 2020, Sarah completed a secondment as a trial manager for a Welsh
Government funded project relating to complex PTSD. Sarah is now passionate about
trauma-informed care and is a member of the local Maternity Voices and Birth Trauma forums.



Charlotte Frise is a Consultant Obstetric Physician based at Queen Charlotte's and Chelsea Hospital in London. She was recently appointed as Lead Consultant Obstetric Physician for NW London. She is co-editor-in-chief of the journal Obstetric Medicine: the medicine of pregnancy, and author of Obstetric Medicine, in the Oxford Specialist Handbooks of Obstetrics and Gynaecology series. Her second book, Oxford Case Histories in Obstetric Medicine is due in 2023. She is also a Senior College Lecturer in Clinical Medicine at Keble College, University of Oxford. She greatly enjoys clinical work and is looking forward to being part of the steering committee to help address important areas in clinical care.



Yasmin Jamil graduated in 2006 and has a background in Acute and General medicine. Having trained in obstetric medicine at Guys and St Thomas Hospital in 2016, she is now a Consultant Obstetric Physician co-leading the North Central London Maternal Medicine Network. She is also junior consultant representative for the joint committee for RCP and MOMS and member of the Society for Acute Medicine Obstetric Medicine Interface Group. Her other role is an acute medical consultant at Whittington Hospital NHS Trust where she is the mortality lead for the acute medicine department. Alongside these roles she is clinical advisor to HSIB. She has a passion for improving acute care pathways for pregnant women as well as learning from incidents and deaths and now is very much looking forward to supporting research in rare disorders in pregnancy.

Vinnie Sodhi has been the Clinical Lead for High Risk Obstetric Anaesthesia at Queen Charlotte's and Chelsea Hospital since she was appointed as a consultant in 2004. As such she has always been passionate about safety and quality of care for all mothers, and has thus been actively involved in education and research to optimise care. Vinnie has served on the Obstetric Anaesthetists Association Executive Committee supporting the production of guidelines for anaesthetic care in maternity, and the provision of evidence-based information for mothers. She is delighted now to have the opportunity to work with UKOSS as the OAA representative on the UKOSS committee. Vinnie hopes to be able to further contribute to the information available to mothers and healthcare professionals so that mothers can receive optimal care.



Case Definition Reminders!

We thought it would be useful to remind you of some of the case definitions for our studies to ensure that the correct cases are being reported to us. We have recently been receiving a number of cases reported in error so it would assist us greatly if the case definition was checked prior to the report being submitted.

Biologics:

All pregnant women identified as having taken one of the following biological agents for the indication of treatment of an inflammatory disorder in pregnancy:

Natulizumab, Duplilimab, Mepolizumab, Ustekinumab, Belimumab, Rituximab, Secukinumab, Ixekizumab, Tociluzumab, Canakinumab, Anakinra, Sarilumab, Abatacept, Guselkumab, Omalizumab, Dupilumab, Mepolizumab, Vedolizumab, Rinsakizumab, Anifrolumab, and 'other' novel biological agent (excluding any TNF inhibitors such as Etanercept, Adalimumab, Infliximab, Certolizumab and their biosimilars).

New Therapies for Influenza:

Any pregnant woman admitted to hospital with influenza who receives at least one dose of intravenous Zanamivir.

Pregnancy in Women with Known Cardiomyopathy

All pregnant women with an established diagnosis of cardiomyopathy. This includes women with known dilated cardiomyopathy, hypertrophic cardiomyopathy, previous peripartum cardiomyopathy and arrhythmogenic right ventricular cardiomyopathy (ARVC).

SEVERE Pyelonephritis:

All pregnant women with severe pyelonephritis requiring hospital admission and IV antibiotics for at least 48 hours (Pyelonephritis defined as at least 2 of the following: pyrexia / loin pain / positive urine culture)

Thombotic Microangiopathy Associated Pregnancy Acute Kidney Injury

All pregnant women who meet the following criteria:

A rise in serum creatinine to >200 mmol/l **AND** platelet count <150x10⁹ **AND** at least one evidence of haemolysis (fragments on blood film, haptogl0obin below lower limit of normal or lactate dehydrogenase above upper limit of normal)

Excluded: All women established on renal replacement therapy prior to the acute AKI episode.

New Therapies for Influenza


This study closes in April. Please could you double check that no cases have been missed and notify us as soon as possible if any cases have been identified.
